Charitable giving,

in my mind, should not be stressful, painful or fraught with cynicism. This Scriptural quote expresses it well: *Each*

man [or woman] should give what he has decided in his heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. (2 Corinthians 9:7, NIV) This verse of Scripture is a good model for a mindset of giving. We all work hard for what we have. I for one, become very uncomfortable when I feel pressured to give of my resources with a "sales pitch" aimed at making me feel guilty or obligated. The harder the sell, the more likely I am to walk away.

I choose to carry out fund-raising for the Soup Kitchen in a very low key manner. The best kind of fund-raising is when both the donor and the donee receive a benefit from the transaction and feel good about it. The Sonshine Soup Kitchen exists because the community sees the need for what is done here, values it, and supports it. Although an effort is made to let the community know of our needs (volunteers, food and money), it is never in the way of a "big event". We all know that these types of support efforts have their place, but I see them as a drain on time and resources better spent on the mission of this organization.

The thing is, this passive type of fund-raising can become worrisome for the Board, as the primary purpose of any nonprofit board is fiscal responsibility. The Soup Kitchen Board has been working toward a better balance between my faith budget mentality that all our needs will be met and their comfortable assurance that it will happen. Thus you will see a little more overt activity in establishing a more steady steam of reliable income in this newsletter and in future editions.

That being said, I do encourage you, if your heart is in it, to consider coming out to the Weathervane on November 8, the Monarch's hockey game on February 25, and taking advantage of the offer of TD Bank.



A couple of weeks ago while doing a weekly inventory, it hit me that our non-perishable food supply was very low, along with our frozen meats. I started contemplating the next week's menus and how many meals we could make with canned tuna or hot dogs. Then it was 1:00 and time to open the office which meant answering the phone and greeting visitors, and whatever else the day had in store.

Shortly after I opened the office, a father and his two sons walked in. One of the children, Cody, had grown flowers and vegetables all summer in his garden. He offered them to passersby for free and let them know if they did leave money, it would be donated to the Sonshine Soup Kitchen. Well, his flowers and veggies were so beautiful people left donations – for the entire summer. To see this handsome young boy with his bright smile and his bright blue eyes present me with this envelope full of money truly touched my heart.

While Cody and I were still talking, a group of people came in with a huge check. (Literally. See the photo.) They were from the Stonyfield Farm Employee Golf League and had organized a golf tournament to benefit the Soup Kitchen. Not only did they present me with a check, they also collected items from our needs list. I was so surprised and touched at this point, I was almost speechless.

As the day went on, it quieted down, business as usual. Then I heard a knock at the door. A gentleman and his wife walked in. It was their one year wedding anniversary. They explained to me that they were very blessed, not in a monetary way, but in many other ways. They decided instead of spending money on themselves on anniversary presents they would donate to the Sonshine Soup Kitchen. They printed the needs list off the website, and proceeded to purchase several of each and every item on the list. This time I was speechless.

I am frequently reminded that when I feel a sense of concern that the food will run out and what would happen if it did and how many lives would be affected, I need to remember that I am in no way in charge here. None of us are. Only Jesus is, and on this particular day Jesus walked here. Three times in one day I was reminded of this fact and am grateful for the reminder of whose ministry this is.

The Main Ingredient

Food safety issues are headline news these days.

Do you know the most com-

mon way food becomes contaminated? It is because of improper hygiene practices of food preparers and servers. The most important thing you can do to ensure the safety of the food we provide at the Soup Kitchen is to wash your hands thoroughly and often.

It is important to only use the designated hand washing sink in the kitchen, or the bathroom sink. To wash your hands thoroughly:

- 1. Use hot water to wet your hands.
- 2. Apply soap and rub your hands together vigorously for 10-15 seconds (about how long it takes to sing the alphabet song).
- 3. Make sure to wash between your fingers and around your wrists and thumbs as well.
- 4. Rinse thoroughly using hot water.
- 5. Dry your hands using a paper towel. Use the paper towel to turn off the faucet, and to open the door if you are in the bathroom.

Wash your hands often. Wash them right after signing in, before preparing or serving food or setting the tables. Wash your hands after using the bathroom, after fixing your hair, touching your mouth, nose or eyes, after blowing your nose, or coughing or sneezing into your hands (cough or sneeze into your upper arm instead, facing away from any food).

Wash your hands after handling raw food, making coffee, opening cans, or sorting through the bread table. Wash them after handling dirty dishes, after performing a cleaning task, or taking out the trash. Wash your hands after eating, drinking, or smoking. Wash them after shaking someone's hand, after going out to your car, using your cell phone, or going to the office to get something. When in doubt, wash your hands!

Other important things to do to ensure food safety at the Soup Kitchen include staying home if you are ill or have an infected wound, and maintaining your personal cleanliness. Shower or bathe daily. Keep your nails short and clean. Remove nail polish or fake nails. Wear clean clothes and aprons. Leave rings, bracelets and other jewelry at home because they can harbor bacteria. Tie back long hair. Do not smoke, drink, chew gum, or eat in food preparation areas. Bandage any cuts. If the cut is on your hand, wear a glove over the bandage at all times. Use gloves when preparing ready to serve food (more about gloves

another time).

All of these "suggestions" are actually part of the NH State Code adopted by Derry's Health Department. I know these things seem very basic, but sometimes we get so caught up in getting the meal ready that we forget to follow the basics of good hygiene. And sometimes we need to remind each other of what we are forgetting to do to

keep our guests safe. Christine catches me rubbing my nose many times when I don't even realize I'm doing it, and tells me "WASH YOUR HANDS!"

Inclement weather notice







Dear Soup Kitchen Supporter:

TD Bank has offered us a new fundraising opportunity called the Affinity Membership Program. There is no cost to Affinity Members, or the Sonshine Soup Kitchen. This is TD Bank's effort to support non-profit groups in the communities they serve. TD Bank would be the contributor of this income, but you have a large part in making it happen.

If you already have an account with TD Bank, you can become an Affinity Member by calling your local store and asking that your account be linked to the Sonshine Soup Kitchen, **code: A2904**. The Sonshine Soup Kitchen would earn ½% on the average checking account balance of your account, and ½% on the average balance of most other interest-bearing accounts.

If you open a new account with any TD Bank location and tell your banker that you would like your account to benefit the Sonshine Soup Kitchen, they will designate you as an Affinity Member and link your accounts to **code: A2904**. The Sonshine Soup Kitchen would earn the same percentage allowance as described above. TD Bank will even contribute \$25 to YOU to get you started.
