suffering personal hardships during their time out of work, but that SSK and the area's food pantries were all ready to help. Then, we mentioned the gift cards, but that we did not want to insult or anger his crew by crossing their demonstration lines without his and the staff's permission.

"No problem!" he replied. "How may we help? And, by the way, could you use some eggs?"

Assuring him we could, off we rolled with our carts and those gift cards in hand, filling the carts to overflowing with butter, mayo and tons of paper products and cleaning supplies. Three carts later, we checked out, to be met in the parking lot by Mark's veteran associate, Vinnie Bruno, and his pickup—the "Eggmobile"! Our then three-vehicle caravan headed for the office, honking in support as we passed Market Basket staff demonstrating on Rte. 102 in Londonderry.

But what to do with all that hen fruit? Don, one of our super volunteer chefs, arrived and quickly changed the menu to quiche. We packed every available inch of fridge space, froze yolks and whites for future use, and then Christine began calling her friends at the area food pantries: First Baptist Church, St. Jude's, St. Thomas Aquinas, Shepherd's Pantry in Windham, Salvation Army, and the Upper Room. They all joyfully shared in our largesse. We even had our volunteer drivers take a dozen to each of our homebound guests along with that day's hot dinner.

We've since received many other generous donations of food from the store, but we'll always remember "The Day of the Outsized Omelet."

Build to FEED



When will Phase 2 of the building campaign begin? This is the burning question. First off, you need to know about Phase 1 and how Phase 2 is defined.

Two years ago, the Sonshine Soup Kitchen was offered a \$50,000 grant. There were not a lot of strings attached to the money, but we did need to apply for it and state our case on how the money would be used. We

chose to apply for the grant as the beginning of a capital campaign to buy a place of our own. There are many reasons why the Soup Kitchen Board decided that the time and conditions were right to relocate, the

biggest one being universal accessibility. Part of the conditions of the grant is that it would need to be used as a fund-raising match. We began the campaign that we call *Build to FEED* in September of 2012 and reached our goal of \$50,000 by April 2012. And since then, we have accumulated another \$23,000.

A second condition was that we needed to find a suitable location, which we call Phase 2 of the campaign. And this is where we are currently stalled. Our analysis of location requirements keeps us in downtown Derry in a building at least 4,000 S.F. with parking on-site or close by. This narrows the field considerably, and at this time we believe we have explored every open site and need to just wait for a property to become available.

The entire Soup Kitchen Board and a top local commercial real estate broker are constantly on the lookout while brainstorming other creative solutions.

Please keep this project in your prayers.


